The EFMP Coordinator is located at the **Airman & Family Readiness Center** and will assist : AD family members already enrolled in the EFMP; those with suspected or diagnosed medical, educational, emotional/psychological needs; any DoD card holders with concerns.

What is the EFMP— Family Support Function?

The Exceptional Family Member Program— Family Support function is designed to provide support, information, and resources to military dependents with diagnosed or suspected special needs.

At the **Airman & Family Readiness Center**, the EFMP Coordinator is available to ensure that each family receives comprehensive coordinated family support through the military and/or civilian community.

The EFMP Coordinator can also recommend appropriate local, state, and national resources.

☰ Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) Coordinator - Family Support:

Exceptional Family Member Program:

Mandatory enrollment program administered by the AF Personnel Center (AFPC) that works with the medical community and key community

agencies to identify AD sponsors who have family members with special educational or medical needs.



Agencies that assist EFMP Families :

- **Special Needs Identification and Assignment Coordination Process (SNIAC):** Portion of EFMP support that documents and evaluates the needs of family members in order to advise families and AF personnel on the appropriateness of family member travel. Located in the Medical Group.
- **Air Force Personnel Center-Assignments Branch:** Work with the SNIAC and the EFMP Coordinator—Family Support to help coordinate relocation of EFMs with their sponsors.
- Many other program and agencies available!!

The EFMP Coordinator

Offers assistance with:

- **Relocation:** Assist families with information and referrals about medical and educational needs.
- **Information & Referrals:** About base and community programs that will assist EFMs in their specific needs.
- **One-on-one consultations:** Available to any Airman, DoD civilian, or military family member seeking information to support family members with special needs.
- **Support Groups:** Educational meetings, formal and informal discussions where families can share fears, hopes, information and plans with other families while learning from each other.



What is an (EFM) Exceptional Family Member?

An EFM is a family member of, an AD sponsor, enrolled in DEERS who has been diagnosed with a physical, emotional, intellectual, or psychological condition that requires ongoing specialized medical or educational services.

Things you probably didn't know:

- EFMP Coordinators can offer assistance to military dependents not already enrolled in the program.
- EFMP Coordinators can also offer support to Reservists, Guardsmen, and DoD civilians.
- Respite Care Program is intended for Active Duty AF families who have family member with special needs.
- Give Parents a Break referrals are available for Active Duty AF members who have a child between the ages of 6 weeks-12 years old with special needs.

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
